LAND TRUSTS

LTABC represents 40 land trusts across British Columbia with an additional 15 Associate members, including land trusts in Alberta.

In 2022, LTABC marked 25 years of service to the land trust community.

PROGRAMS & SERVICES

LTABC held a one-day virtual mini-conference in April.

On the success of the virtual conference a series of monthly webinars began with a focus on Indigenous Engagement.

The Alliance continues to provide insurance to 45 groups and employee benefits to 7 land trusts.

LTABC released the 25th Anniversary Almanac which was distributed to MP's, MLA's, land trusts, and major media outlets across BC.

LTABC, with ACLT and RMN partnered with Nature Canada on a pilot project to encourage municipal land conservation.

BEST PRACTICES

LTABC continues to support the Canadian Land Trust Standards & Practices, and resources and webinars provide references for land trusts to use.

The final draft of *Greening Your Title* was completed in December with an anticipated release Spring 2023.

The Alliance produced a generic brochure for land trusts to educate and encourage donors to support endowment funds. LTABC also produced a FAQ Sheet for Indigenous Engagement to encourage land trusts to consider adaptable approaches to conservation.

THE ALLIANCE

LTABC was a partner with ACLT, OLTA and RMN presenting the successful 2022 Land Trust Summit in Ottawa in October.

The Alliance continues to support the Land Trust Conservation Fund working with ACLT and Wildlife Habitat Canada.

LTABC receives funding from BC Gaming, LTFCF Capacity Building, memberships, and donations.

LTABC has two Board positions on the Alliance of Canadian Land Trusts – one land trust representative and one Alliance representative.

Outreach

LTABC's social media has more than 11,000 followers.

The Alliance website receives more than 350,000 visitors annually.

Our E-news saw a 15% increase in subscribers and continues to profile members and news on conservation in BC.

The Alliance coordinated a campaign to MLA's and MP's in September encouraging them to post about LTABC on social media.

LTABC met with the Federal Environment Committee, the federal Minister's Office, Staff at Environment and Climate Change Canada.
